# **2025 Annual General Meeting**

#### Other Awards to be determined

In 2025 there will be awards given in the following categories:

- Senior Player of the Year—Criteria—To be awarded to a player who has achieved notable tennis success over the past year in Seniors tournaments in Australia and/or internationally at ITF Team Championships and/or World Individual Championships.
- Administrator of the Year—Criteria—A person who has made a significant contribution to the administration of Seniors Tennis. This award recognises contributions over the past twelve months, but also takes other previous contributions into consideration.
- Player Recognition—Criteria—Significant improvement in their standard of tennis over the past year. Remarkable recovery from a severe injury which prevented tennis participation. Continued involvement in 30+ seniors tennis over a prolonged period of time, with a high level of integrity. Taken into consideration will also be on-court behaviour, etiquette and 'spirit of the game'.

A nominee for any of the above awards must be a current financial member of Tennis Seniors NSW. Nominations close on 1 November 2025.

#### 2027 Australian Seniors Tennis Carnival

Tennis Seniors NSW has been awarded the hosting of the above carnival, to be held between 3 and 15 January 2027. The Committee has determined that the carnival will be staged at various venues in the Newcastle district and negotiations have progressed with a number of clubs eager to be involved. A lot of preparation goes into the running of these events and without the assistance of volunteers, the outcomes are usually less than what is hoped for.

Tennis Seniors Australia determines how the carnival will be administered and a detailed set of guidelines are provided to the host State which is expected to organise everything, but specifically:

- 1 The Management and Conduct of the Carnival,
- 2. Structure, format and rules of the Australian Teams Carnival,
- 3. Social Programme,
- 4. Sponsorship and Publicity,
- 5. Player Transport and Court Location,
- 6. Financial Arrangements,
- 7. Reports and Evaluation,
- 8. The Tournament Director's Job Description, and
- 9. Preparation of and adherence to a checklist for the Australian Teams Carnival plus and Australian Individual Championships.

As such, Tennis Seniors NSW will be seeking to appoint a Chairperson of the Organising Committee who will in turn assist in appointing an Organising Committee. This Committee will be responsible for the progressive organisation of the events and their overall day to day direction. Ideally these appointments should be made 18 months in advance of the carnival. Tennis Seniors Australia has provided a timeline document as a guide to the key tasks that are required to be performed.

It can be seen from the above tasks that this is an exciting but challenging undertaking and Tennis Seniors NSW is starting its search now for people to fill the important roles as outlined. If you believe that you have the time and the energy required to see this project through, then we would love to hear from your. Detailed information about what is required is available from the Secretary. Please indicate your interest in the role of either the Chairperson of the Organising Committee or one of the Organising Committee Members and a complete set of details will be provided to you prior to you making any determination to participate. Teams events will be held during the period 3 to 10 January 2027 with individual events to follow, concluding on 15 January 2027.

#### **2026 Masters Teams Carnival**

Just a reminder that team entries for the above event will close very soon.

For those not familiar with the concept, an annual carnival of tennis is held in each state on a rotational basis in January. The competition provides an opportunity for teams to be formed amongst friends/ acquaintances in various age groups, to compete as part of a New South Wales contingent. Players compete from all states of Australia. The 2026 edition will be hosted by Tennis Seniors Queensland and held between 4 and 9 January 2026 on the Gold Coast. With ample accommodation options and great attractions for family members, the location is perfect for that family getaway. A team entry is \$130 per player. As part of the carnival events, a state dinner will be hosted by Tennis Seniors NSW in conjunction with **Strathfield Sports Club (major sponsor)** and will be held at the Emerald Hills Golf Club. The cost will be \$65 for a three course meal. As this venue is one of the most popular on the tennis calendar, it is strongly suggested that if you are planning to attend, you need to start getting your team together asap. # New South Wales to the Fore Again in the 2025 Tri State Challenge



A team of 12 Men and 12 Women from Tennis Seniors NSW faced a strong contingent of players from both Victoria and South Australia in the recent Tri State Challenge, held in the pretty Murray River town of Barham on the Victorian border. The series, reborn in 2023 after a long hiatus had been won the two previous years by NSW, and the Victorians, in particular, were out for revenge.

Over the weekend of 13 & 14 September 2025 in warm conditions on 14 beautifully manicured lawn tennis courts, the teams battled it out in both women's and men's doubles and mixed doubles to score points for their State. At the end of proceedings, NSW again came out a narrow winner.

In the Brian Bermingham Shield, played between NSW and Victoria, after 60 sets of tennis and 566 games played, NSW won by 31 sets and 289 games to Victoria's 29 sets and 277 games. Phew!!

In the Bob McCarthy Shield, played between NSW and South Australia after 60 sets and 558 games played, NSW came out the victors by 41 sets and 322 games to 19 sets and 236 games.

Next year's Tri State will be held over the weekend of 19 and 20 September, 2026. If you are interested in being considered for selection, please put these dates in your diary. The series is preceded by an ITF MT200 tournament between Wednesday 16 and Friday 18 September 2026. For those not interested in chasing ITF points, but who want to hone their skills for the Tri State, there is an NRT7 tournament held on Thursday 17 and Friday 18 September 2026. An all doubles format for Women and Men (with Mixed Doubles included) forms the basis of this part of the tournament. A great and fun week of tennis on well manicured courts is guaranteed, so get your friends together and get involved. Members will be asked to nominate for team representation well in advance of the weekend of play, but you must be committed to stay for the full two days of competition in the Tri State. It's not for the feint hearted!

## 2025 ITF World Masters Teams at Bol Island, in Croatia

Australia sent four teams to compete in the World Masters for Men and Women over the age of 75 years.

In the 75 + Women's Queens Cup, Helen Worland and partner Sheryl Kerwick went through the Group C draw undefeated, dispatching France, Canada and Sweden along the way. In a playoff for the title, the pair lost to the USA 2-1, but defeated the other qualifier Finland 3-0 to finish in second place.

The Bitsy Grant Cup for Men 75+ saw 6 groups competing, with Australia (including Tony Dawson) faring best in Group F to qualify for the playoffs. Unfortunately, a loss to 3rd seeded USA 1-2 in the first round saw the end of competition in the series for the Aussies.

A surprising number of teams competed in the Gardnar Mulloy Cup for 80+ Men, with fifteen countries represented. Australia (including Alan Walsh) finished second in Group B and in the playoffs for the title, defeated Canada 2-1 before losing out to the top seeded USA 3-0. The USA team went on to win the Cup, 2-1 against second seeded France.

The Angela Mortimer Cup for Women 85 and over, saw five nations competing, with the Aussies finishing in fourth place, winning one match against Argentina.

#### 2025 Forster Seniors' Decimated by Rain
